What are BMPs?

Best Management Practices (BMPs) are ways that we can change our behavior on land to prevent or reduce pollution in the groundwater, bays and rivers.

BMPs are simple and are beneficial to the health of humans and wildlife. Using these practices will help improve water quality and support healthier ecosystems by protecting our estuary against pollutants such as fertilizers, pesticides, oil and gas products, and hazardous materials.

Leave No Trace

- Leave only footprints.
 Stick to marked trails to avoid harming native flora.
- Buy local.
- Throw out any garbage you bring to the park or beach.
- Clean up your pet's waste.
- Keep a respectful distance from wildlife and never feed wildlife for any reason.

- Avoid eelgrass meadows and abide by speed zones.
- Use pump out stations.
- Avoid introducing invasive species to new areas by following these tips for your watercraft:

Drain
Disinfect
Dry

Do at Home

- Plant low maintenance native plants or install a rain barrel to reduce runoff to our bays.
- Wash your car over a patch of grass or take it to a car wash.
- Use natural cleaning products.
- Update your septic system or cesspool.
- Properly dispose of old unused medication at your local drugstore or police department.
- Reduce/eliminate fertilizer use; never apply before it rains.
- Leave grass clippings on your lawn to supply nutrients instead.
