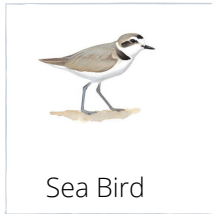

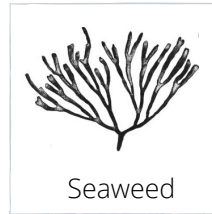

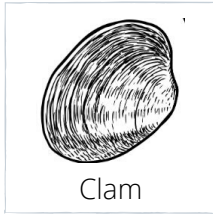


Slipper Snail Shell

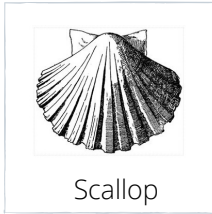

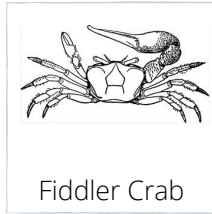

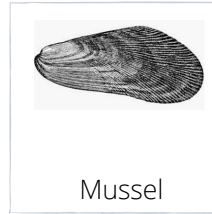
